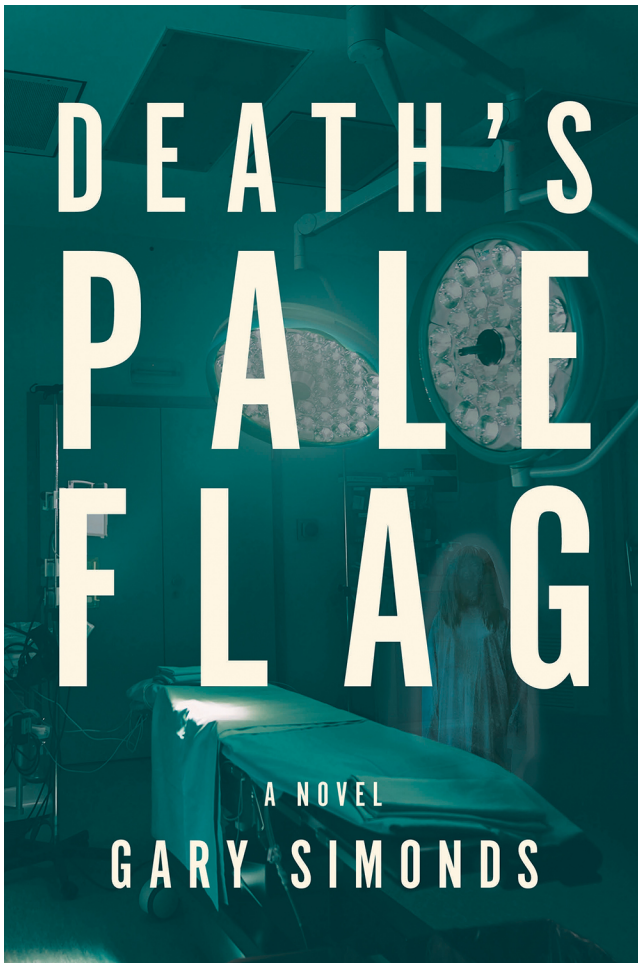


Death's Pale Flag
